



Environmental Guidance

Skills South Tyneside is committed to minimising the impact of its activities on the environment by following legislative guidelines and working in partnership with all agencies. All Skills South Tyneside staff are expected to follow environmental policy guidelines.

The key points are:

- Minimise waste by evaluating all operations and ensuring they are as efficient as possible.
- Actively promote recycling both internally and amongst participants and partners.
- Meet or exceed all the environmental legislation that relates to the organisation.
- Comply with all relevant legislation and regulations.
- Encourage participants to regularly review the environmental impact of activities, endeavour to reduce our overall environmental impact and prevent waste.
- Sustain a programme of continual improvement in environmental performance incorporating suitable measurement and monitoring mechanisms.
- Improve resource efficiency (including our use of water, energy and raw materials).

The reduce, reuse and recycle concept will be promoted by all staff and shared with participants to ensure paper, printing, resources are reduced, reused and recycled where and when possible.

Staff meetings will take account of this issue and ideas will be shared and promoted amongst partners to ensure that all are mindful of environmental issues and are contributing to a supportive approach.

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
